Ans. Mangrove forest are mainly situated on Gangetic Delta, and in coastal plains of West Bengal, called the Sunderbans. Plants growing in these forests include Sundri tree and various other trees, shurbs, ferns and palms.

Deciduous forests are found mainly on the foothills of the Himalayas and wetter regions of the Southern plateau The principal trees in these forests are teak sal, sandalwood etc.
